- *Blackboard K-12* is Cambrian's current Content Management System (CMS)
- In Sep 2022, Blackboard was acquired by *Finalsite*
- Finalsite is encouraging Blackboard customers to move to their CMS, *Composer*.

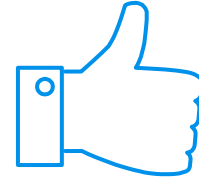
What does this mean for Cambrian?

- ❖ Opportunity to update website organization to be a more effective communication tool for our community



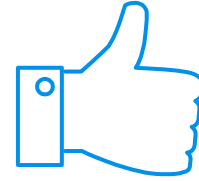
Is This An Upgrade? (1)

- ★ Inline editing
 - WYSIWYG (What You See Is What You Get)
- ★ Advanced search functionality
 - Results preview
 - Analytics
 - Advanced search syntax
- ★ Automated tools for addressing accessibility issues
 - AudioEye



Is This An Upgrade? (2)

- ★ Automatic user-friendly web addresses
 - e.g. <https://www.cambriansd.org/departments>
- ★ Ability to push content to multiple school sites simultaneously
- ★ New/updated content can be saved as draft, published later
- ★ User friendly system for managing files, images, etc.
- ★ Mobile device-friendly templates

Efficient use of space

Reduced screen real estate size of image gallery. Clean, efficient use of space by apps.



Mobile friendly

Easy to navigate on cell phone, tablet.



Integration with...

Social media, calendars, staff authentication systems.



Supports online payment

Optional add-on to support online payment for school and HSC functions.



Navigation ease

“Mega menus” minimize clicks and maximize clarity. Popular links.



Multimedia capable

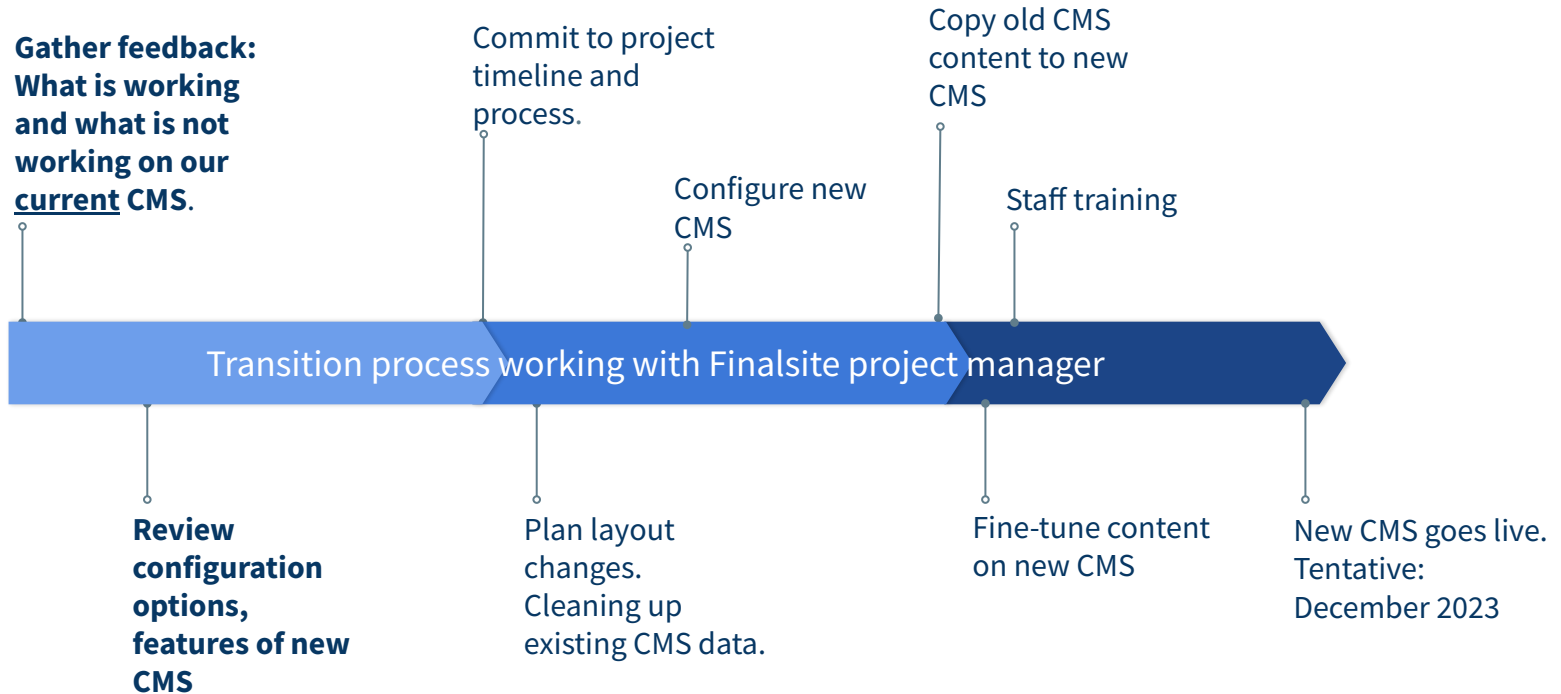
Ease of display and management for videos, images, files, etc.
