10.1 Measure R: Change Order 2A - HVAC in the Common Areas at Bagby, Farnham, and Sartorette: Ms. Cheryl Demeyer from Cumming Group, presented the change order in connection with the replacement of the HVAC equipment in common areas (e.g., offices, libraries, multi-use buildings, etc.) located at Bagby, Farnham, and Sartorette.

ACTION: On a motion by Trustee Gillis, seconded by Trustee Villalobos, the Board ratified the one (1) necessary change order; 2A in connection with the HVAC projects in the Common Area at Bagby, Farnham, and Sartorette. Motion **CARRIED** 3-0

10.3 Measure R: Resolution 24-25-11 - Declaring the Futility of Public Bidding for General Trades Services for the HVAC in the Common Areas at Fammatre and Price: Ms. Cheryl Demeyer from Cumming Group, presented the resolution. The resolution will allow the district to continue with Beals Martin & Associates to complete the current project in process with the 12.96% increase over the original contracted amount due to condensing units being relocated per Division of the State Architect (DSA) requirements.

- 10.5 <u>Resolution 24-25-09: Adopting Certain Findings and Approving Energy Services Contract</u>: Chief Financial Officer, Dr. John Pappalardo, presented Resolution 24-25-09. The resolution will allow the Cambrian School District to enter into an Energy Service Contract with Centrica Business Solutions, Inc. for energy conservation services.

10.6 <u>Contract Agreement: Centrica Business Solutions, Inc. - Phase Two: Solar:</u> Chief Financial Officer, Dr. John Pappalardo, presented the contract agreement for Centrica Business Solutions to implement Phase 2 energy conservation improvements. The total contract amount is \$ 2,260,671.

ACTION: On a motion by Trustee Villalobos, seconded by Trustee Gillis, the Board approved the contract agreement with Centrica Business Solutions, Inc. for Phase Two of the energy conservation improvements. Motion **CARRIED** 3-0

10.7 <u>School Site Comprehensive Safety Plans: Annual Review and Approval</u>: Ms. Maggie Spehar, Director of Student Services, shared an overview of the Comprehensive Safety Plan for each school site. The plans are a collection of procedures for schools to utilize in the event of an emergency, and provide guidelines which promote a safe learning space for all.

ACTION: On a motion by Trustee Gillis, seconded by Trustee Villalobos, the Board approved the Site Comprehensive Safety Plans for each school site and allow them to be available to the public. Motion **CARRIED** 3-0

- 10.8 <u>Budget: Governor's Budget Proposal January 2025</u>: Dr. John Pappalardo, Chief Financial Officer, summarized the Governor's Budget Proposal for the 2025-26 State Budget. The Governor shared that California's economy is continuing to grow, and with the increased economic uncertainty, there are notable risks with the State Budget and economic forecast. The Governor projects a surplus and healthy reserves and the one-time funding for education has expired. CalSTRS projects the employer contribution rate will remain the same at 19.10%, where, CalPERS employer contribution rate would increase from the current rate of 27.05% to 27.40%
- 10.9 <u>Budget: Fiscal Stability:</u> Chief Financial Officer, Dr. John Pappalardo, reviewed the Budget Advisory Committee's goal and criteria to help identify and recommend strategies to reduce deficit spending by approximately \$2 million for the 2025-26 school year. The Governing Board and staff had the opportunity to review and discuss the potential reductions to ensure the district remained fiscally solvent.

ACTION: On a motion by Trustee Gillis, seconded by Trustee Villalobos, the Board approved moving forward with the reductions presented by staff. Motion **CARRIED** 3-0

- 10.10 <u>Local Control Accountability Plan Mid-Year Update 2024-25</u>: The Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services, Mr. Linh Nguyen, provided an update on the Local Control Accountability Plan. Mr. Nguyen recapped the plan's goals, which address the eight state priorities, and highlighted the Local Control Accountability Plan mid-year budget.
- 10.11 Resolution: 24-25-10 Affirming Support of Equal Access to Education for All Children and Families
 Regardless of Immigration Status at Schools: Superintendent Schwiebert presented Resolution: 24-25-10
 affirming equal access to education for all children and families regardless of immigration status. Cambrian
 School District and the Governing Board are committed to the success of all students irrespective of their
 immigration status or citizenship and believe that every school site should be a welcoming place for all students
 and their families.

10.12 School Year Calendar: 2025-26 - Proposed, Resolution 24-25-07: Observance of Holiday on Alternate Date, and Resolution 24-25-08: Day of the Employee: Superintendent Schwiebert presented the proposed 2024-25 school year calendar. The calendar reflects one hundred eighty (180) student days and one hundred eighty-five (185) teacher work days and one (1) additional day for new teachers. In developing the calendar options, consideration was given to aligning the calendars to the neighboring elementary and high school districts as much as possible. The calendar was reviewed by representatives from the Cambrian District Teachers' Association and the California State Employees' Association with a positive approval response.
